A bright future for orthopaedic surgery

Our brand-new centre for planned surgery for orthopaedic patients will open in 2024 and will be one of the largest centres of its kind in Europe.

With **eight new theatres** and more than **70 beds** over **three wards** in our state-of-the-art building, we aim to operate on over 10,000 patients every year for day case and inpatient surgery.

The centre is being designed as a surgical hub, bringing together the skills and expertise of staff in one place for some of our most common procedures such as hip and knee replacements. By pooling our expertise, we will bring down waiting times, develop and maintain specialist surgery, and train and grow the surgical professionals of the future.

Improving patient care

Essex and Suffolk Elective Orthopaedic Centre has been designed to function as a dedicated space for elective care, providing clinical sustainability as well as future pandemic resilience.

Though attached to the Colchester Hospital and having the benefit of proximity to other services as and when needed, the centre will be able to function independently to keep surgical beds and theatres free for patients waiting for planned surgery.



In addition, we will have purpose-built X-ray and physiotherapy facilities to support our patients' recovery, and a swift discharge.

Our patient areas have been designed and shaped with and by patients. Each ward will have **two four-bedded bays** and **16 side rooms** for a relaxed and comfortable recovery and further monitoring. From the design of the clinical spaces to the welcome they will receive, our patients have been with us all the way.

Our service has been designed for the future. Designed as a centre of excellence, we will offer:

- a state-of-the-art clinical environment
- reduced infection rates, cancellations and waiting lists
- improved patient experience and vastly reduced length of stay

Through our Faculty of Education, which is associated to the Universities of Suffolk, Essex and Anglia Ruskin University, we have a wide range of apprenticeship opportunities and specialist courses, as well as leadership development programmes through other specialist providers, such as the King's Fund and NHS Elect. The centre also has its own dedicated training facilities.
